I am a lawyer with Chihuly Studios.


I write concerning the articles

You should know that this is not a genuine Chihuly chandelier. If you believe it is, please provide documented evidence. If not, please immediately update the articles to remove any claim that the artwork is a Chihuly chandelier, and print a correction immediately for the sentences: "Chef Laurent Tasic, having perfected the bistro genre with his country-quaint Fort Lauderdale Sage Café, has set his Hollywood vessel afloat in a chic, ultramarine landscape, incorporating such varied terrain — a backlit bar, leaping flames from an open grill, a glacier-colored shellfish bar, transparent wine cellar, and a tentacular Dale Chihuly chandelier . . ." and "Where Sage north, going strong for 18 years, is all cozy French country and lace curtains, its southern sister is extreme chic — a gorgeous, oceanic Dale Chihuly chandelier in the foyer . . ."

The integrity of Chihuly works and the Chihuly name are obviously very important to us, and we wanted to address this issue quickly. We appreciate your commitment to accurate articles and advertising, and wish your business every success. We look forward to your response by July 15, 2009.
